

#### Petra-Tsikhisdziri Fort:

A weathered monument perched atop a rugged, rocky hill in the village of Tsikhisdziri, Petra Fortress occupies an important place in Georgian and Byzantine history. Located about 23 kilometres from Batumi, Petra was once an impregnable citadel connecting western Georgia with the Byzantine provinces and dominating the eastern coast of the Black Sea. Today, although in ruins, it offers a fascinating portal into a rich past that spans Europe and Central Asia.



#### Vani Archaeological Museum:

Located in the Imereti region, near the Vani archaeological site. It was founded on September 25, 1985, on the initiative of Academician Otar Lortkipanidze, the head of the Vani Archaeological Expedition. The material preserved in the Vani Museum dates to 800 BCE-100 CE. Unique samples of gold, silver, bronze wares, numismatics and more are kept here.



#### Kutaisi State Historical Museum:

Established in 1921 in the former National Bank building, contains more than 200,000 artifacts displaying the archaeological, numismatic, palaeogeographical, ethnographical and spiritual heritage of Georgia. Artefacts date from between the 9th Century BC, to the late Medieval period, artefacts from across Georgian, Roman, Byzantine history, including manuscripts, items of jewellery, pottery, leather, textiles and woodwork. Of particular interest is the Gold Treasury Hall, displaying many religious gold pieces, removed from the Bagrati cathedral.



### Gonio-Apsarus Fort:

Located at municipality of Khelvachauri, in the Autonomous Republic of Ajara. This typical Roman shape fort was occupied by auxiliary cohorts and legionary troops since 1<sup>st</sup> century to 4<sup>th</sup> century AD. There are remains of Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman period architectural ruins, exhibition halls and several historical attractions.



### Borjgalo ethnographical Museum:

The Museum is located about 2 km away from Batumi covering 3000 m<sup>2</sup> with suitable infrastructure, greenery and pedestrian paths. 62 mannequins representing the life and traditions of local people including workmanship, industrial farming, woodcarving, residential or industrial buildings and 11 meters high waterfall with the forest cover. Ethnographic museum is the first private museum in Georgia and presented domain, sculpture or houses are created by only one person, Kemal Turmanidze because of his dedication and hard work for decades.



### Makhuntseti Medieval bridge and fall:

High Medieval period arch bridge (length: 24 m; width 2-2.5 m; height above the water level 6 m) located at the village of Makhuntseti, Keda municipality. Natural rocks of different heights are used as piers. Local market with all traditional food and drinks and souvenirs along the route to the waterfall to the distance of 50 m.

<b><u>Keda Historical Museum:</u></b> <i>Showcasing the Keda region's history through archaeological finds (tools, coins), geological samples, local art, and ethnographic items.</i>	
<b><u>Skhalta cathedral:</u></b> <i>Dating from the mid-13<sup>th</sup> century. It is a large hall church design, with fragments of the 14<sup>th</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup> century Palaiologan-style wall painting.</i>
